Juvenile Lobster Monitoring Program

August and September were extremely challenging months for sampling due to unfavorable tide conditions. Some teams were able to sample all of their quadrats, other teams some of their quadrats and some of us were unable to sample at all! Table 1 summarizes the sampling results from June through September.

Fortunately, the remainder of 2008 promises to send us better sampling conditions! It was particularly unfortunate to not be able to reach so many transects in September because it is a month

when we typically find settlement, much molting activity and relatively high densities. Even so, we have detected settlement at 16 of the 22 sites sampled this year.

Dobbins Island was the only team unable to sample their transect line in July. That was not for want of trying! Lynn Alley has been dedicated to accomplishing the monthly lobster census with Jonesport High School students since 2003. The last batch of students graduated, so I headed Downeast to train the new recruits.

We had an excellent training session under the shelter of the porch at Lynn's brother's pound keeper house overlooking the low tide rocks while the thunder crashed and the lightning flashed. Each claim I made that the storm was letting up was met with a furious response from the sky. The storm desisted too late to reach the transect line but we were able to do some haphazard sampling to give the students hands-on training in handling and measuring lobsters. The group included two licensed lobstermen and all of the students were adept at handling and recognizing characteristics of lobsters thanks to their life-long interactions with the crustaceans. Welcome to the Juvenile Lobster Monitoring Program! This is a terrific new team!
